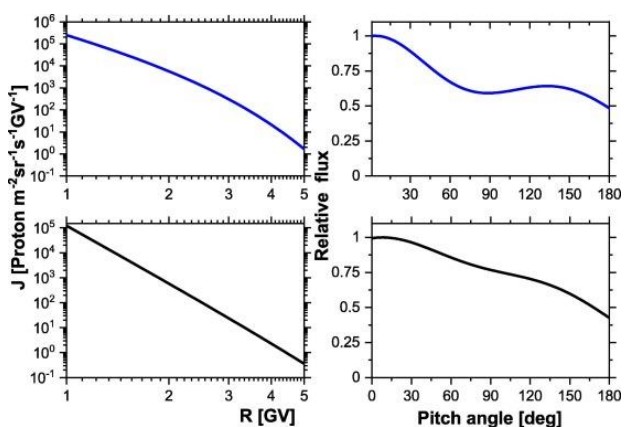

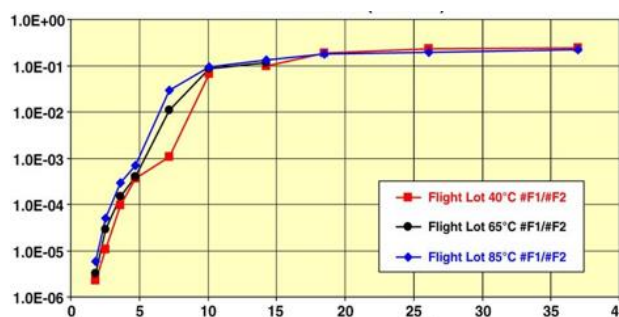
Graph 2: love fluid
